How are the characters feeling?

Today, we are going to be exploring the character's emotions (feelings) throughout the film and how their emotions change at different points in the film.

- First, watch the film again on our class page to remind yourself of what happens, think carefully about how the characters are feeling and how that changes while you are watching.
- 2. We are going to plot the character's emotions on a graph to show how they are feeling at different points.

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<u>How are the characters</u>




Here is an example of what your work might look like. I have used a different colour for each of the characters.

You can either play and pause the film clip while you plot each character, or you can use the strip of pictures at the bottom to help remind you.


