

Use the picture on the slides, or watch the film clip again to help you.




Describing a Scene

- 1. Write a sentence to describe an **object** in the scene on the first slide, using words related to **colour** and **shade**.
- 2. Write a sentence to describe the **setting** using words related to **colour** and **shade**.
- 3. Describe a **noise** you might be able to hear.
- 4. Write down what is happening in the scene.

For an example of what to do before you have a go, look at the next slide. This slide shows the same activity using a different image called Flood by Alvaro F Villa.
