


Science – Forces and Magnets

This unit teaches the children about forces, friction and magnetic attraction. They will learn about forces in the context of pushing and pulling and identify the different actions. Working scientifically and collaboratively they will investigate friction by exploring the movement of a toy car over different surfaces. Using a range of different types of magnets, the children will identify magnetic materials and consider if some magnets are of a different strength.

History – The Bronze Age to Iron Age

The children recap their knowledge of the Stone Age then learn about the Bronze Age through to the Iron Age. This includes the advancements in the use of materials and how Iron Age forts were built as a means of protection.



Year 3 Curriculum

English

This half term the theme of study is an animation; 'The Dream Giver'. The content of our written work will focus heavily on grammar and punctuation including a consistency in the correct use of capital letters, full stops, commas, exclamation marks, question marks, conjunctions, adjectives, adverbs and a use of a high standard of vocabulary.

Art

We will use our observation skills to describe specific shapes, textures or patterns in objects. Following on from this we will practise how to sketch simple shapes as basis of our drawing before using lines and marks to add detail and texture. Developing our shading skills will allow us to show areas of light and dark (tone).

Maths

This half term our maths continues with the topic of multiplication and division by looking at multiples of 10 before consolidating how to multiply and divide a two-digit number by a one-digit number. Further on in the half term we will be looking at length and perimeter.

Religious Education

In RE this half term we focus or study on the following question:

How do festivals and family life show what matters to Jewish people?

PSHE

Promoting the understanding that a healthy lifestyle includes physical activity, a balanced diet, and rest and relaxation; exploring identity through groups we belong to, and how our strengths can be used to help others; learning how to solve problems by breaking them down into achievable steps.

Music

This half term ukulele is being taught in 2 groups every week to promote focus and new learning. Alongside this Mrs Bratton will be teaching music elements such as pulse, rhythm, pitch and notation.

French

We return to French this half term learning colours and how to describe 2D shapes.
